

Travelling by car

North East Car Park - Pay on Exit



Visitors to campus are requested to park in any of the three car parks listed below (charges apply). Locations are:

- **North East Car Park** (access via Pritchatts Road and is located next to 'Fifty-Two')
Sat Nav Postcode B15 2SA (pay on exit)
- North Car Park (access via Pritchatts Rd) Sat Nav Postcode B15 2SB (pay and display)
- Pritchatts Road Car Park (at the junction with Vincent Drive) Sat Nav Postcode B15 2QU (pay and display)

The car parks above are peripheral car parks and can be accessed without entering the main campus. Visitor charges are: Up to 1 hour £2.00, 1-3 hours £3.00, 3-5 hours £4.00, 5-8 hours £6.00

Note:

The North East Car Park has five levels, but there is no lift and there are no designated disabled parking bays.

This car park has vehicle licence plate recognition cameras; the barrier will lift upon arrival. When returning to your car, tap your vehicle registration number into the payment machine and it will tell you how much you need to pay. Then, as you exit the car park, the cameras will recognise your registration plate and will rise up automatically.

**DIRECTIONS FROM NORTH EAST CAR PARK
TO THE BARBER INSTITUTE OF FINE ARTS (R14)**

- On leaving the North East Car park, cross Pritchatts Road into Spur Road.
- Walk through the concrete bollards.
- Six steps up to the walkway bridge, towards Strathcona Building.
- Down eight steps and you will see the Barber building ahead of you. Walk across the car park to reach the building.

Alternatively, to avoid steps:

- Turn left outside the North East Car Park and walk along Pritchatts Road to the junction with Edgbaston Park Road.
- Turn right and you will soon see the Barber building on your right-hand side, in front of which stands the statue of *King George I on horseback* – the oldest piece of public sculpture in Birmingham.
- There is a slight incline up to the Barber building and there is a small flight of steps up to the main entrance. Disabled access is at the rear of the building.
